I hope you can join me **Tuesday, March 4** for the club's first SRC of the year.

Meet at 12 p.m. at the Oakland Bay Rec Area; meet Julie at the WDFW parking lot, just north of the Bayshore Bay Preserve parking area (Discover Pass required). Get directions <u>HERE</u>. Let me know if you're planning to join! (360) 731-2202 or julielkelner@gmail.com.

It's just a short walk down to the 'point', not far from Johns Creek. Catch and release only. Low tide is around 4 p.m., so hopefully we will catch good water movement. Ideal gear list includes barbless hooks, 6wt rod and intermediate and/or floating lines. As for flies, I'd suggest clouser minnows, skinny herring, sculpins, beach poppers, and chum babies. Fly Tying

The monthly fly-tying session is **Saturday**, **March 15** at 9:30 a.m.-11:30 a.m. at Tower Lanes. Join us to tie the stillwater nymph, a simple version of a woolly bugger that can imitate a variety of food forms, such as a damsel, leech or small minnow.



Tips for using the stillwater nymph:

- use intermediate and/or sinking line to experiment with a range of depths
- add weight to your line to help it sink
- experiment with line retrieval techniques to find the action the fish are interested in

Casting Tune-up

Prior to the general meeting on **March 13**, we will conduct a casting tune-up from **4:45-5:45 PM** just down the road at Titlow Beach Park. This is an opportunity to pick up some tips, work on your technique and practice some of those new-found skills in time for the spring season. Just stop by!

The forum offers current information for users on what to fish, where, and which patterns are hitting. Use the forum to post events, share resources, ask questions and organize outings around the area.


